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## STUDENT ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF BEHAVIOUR FOR SUCCESSFUL LEARNING

It is expected that all students have received, read and understood the *Saturday School of Community Languages Behaviour for successful learning* guidelines. It is of vital importance that all students are fully aware of the conditions regarding enrolment and attendance.

The classroom teacher will note the date that students receive the student acknowledgement. Any questions regarding the content should be discussed with the classroom teacher or one of the centre executive team.

We would like to highlight the following points:

- Classes for Years 7 - 10 classes start at 9am and finish at 11.15am. All Years 11 - 12 classes start at 8.30am and finish at 11.45am. There is a recess break from 10am to 10.20am.  
*Variation:* Year 12 Extension Spanish runs from 8am to 9am. Years 11 and 12 Spanish runs from 9am to 12.20pm.
- All students must attend each Saturday of the school term, regardless of the end of term date of their weekday school.
- Students absent from classes must submit a note upon return from the parent explaining the reason for the absence. Late arrivals and early leavers must also be accompanied by a note of explanation. Any student anticipating a family vacation must inform the centre in writing prior to departure with a list of the anticipated dates. Any leave must take into account any missed assessment tasks and be clarified with the classroom teacher and the centre supervisor for alternative arrangements.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited.
- Students leaving the centre early must sign out at the Saturday School Office before departing.
- No responsibility can be taken for students leaving centre grounds without permission.
- All students are expected to abide by all aspects of the Saturday School of Community Languages Behaviour for successful learning and must act responsibly with regards to the use of information and communication technologies.
